


The secrets' of Kurbin Highlands

Kurbin is the land of legends, fairy tales, religious monuments and natural beauties.


It is a part of the country that is much loved by pilgrims, history buffs, nature lovers, history enthusiasts, and adventure seekers.

It is also a place that connects two very important tourist locations. On the one hand, Kruja, which is renowned for its history and traditional tourism, and on the other, Shëngjin, popular for its beaches and beautiful coastline.

The Kurbin Highlands include some of the most beautiful and dramatic landscapes in Albania, with high peaks, dense forests, beautiful rivers, deep gorges and very rich history and traditions. Yet, despite all these tourism potentials, it is very little known or explored. The area is mainly mountainous and consists of two mountain ranges - the Skanderbeg one to the east, and the Milot Crown (Kunora e Milotit) and Suka Peak to the west. The two mountain ranges are divided by Hurdhaza, a river that originates in Mount Skanderbeg, Vinjollë, and flows into River Mat in Skuraj. There are all sorts of opportunities in the area for nature lovers, enthusiasts of hiking, mountain climbing, mountain biking, various sports and outdoor recreational activities. As such, they turn this area into an enchanting and fascinating destination for people who love both nature and adventure tourism. Some of the most interesting places to explore are the following:





The city of

Laç is the beating heart of Kurbin, a place that combines history and culture with the hospitality of its inhabitants. Built as an industrial centre after the 1960s, the city still retains traces of the characteristic architecture of the communist period, offering isitors a journey through time and a unique atmosphere.

Strolling through the main boulevard is a pleasant experience: small cafés and traditional restaurants invite you to enjoy local dishes and fresh drinks, while shops and itinerant artisans offer souvenirs to take with you as a memory of Laç. Those who are passionate about culture may wish to visit the City Library or the historical monuments nearby.

Laç is also an important spiritual centre in Albania. Every year thousands of pilgrims visit St. Anthony's Church, known in the local vernacular as the Church of Laç, a holy place located on the city's picturesque hillside. In addition to its religious value, this area also preserves the ruins of the

ancient fortress of Sebastia, a historical monument of special importance. From this strategic position, visitors may admire a panoramic view that stretches all the way to the Adriatic coast.


The pilgrimage route is also a unique experience. It is a path of about 2.7 km from the city centre to the church, which is traversed on foot through the stairs and uphill, not only making the journey an act of piety and reflection but also an unforgettable adventure and experience for visitors.



Skuraj bridge

The former Archbishopric of Durrës in the village of Delbnisht, one of the main cultural monuments, restored with funds from the EU4Culture program, financed by the European Union and implemented by UNOPS in cooperation with the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sports.

Part of this journey may also include the ruins of the Church of St. Friday (Kisha e Shën Prendes) in Gallatë, an important cultural monument with historical value, which once served as Arbni's Episcopal Seat, Mount **Skanderbeg** and **Hurdhaza Valley**, which offer natural beauty, forests of chestnut, oak, and pine trees, along with abundant water sources.

Built in the style of stone towers with traditional guest rooms and fireplaces, local guesthouses have become a tourist attraction for the Highlands of Kurbin. Visitors are treated like house guests and are given the place of honour, enjoying the warmth and hospitality of the family, and traditional dishes such as chestnut tart (karabec me gështenja), fried pork, chicken with porridge (pulë me qull), roasted kid goat, and granulated sugary pie (laknurin me sheqer), accompanied by honey and walnuts. You will leave looking back with fondness and a bagful of unforgettable memories.

Visitors may also engage in a wide range of outdoor activities, including mountain hiking, scenic trail trekking, mountain biking, off-road adventures with motorbikes or 4x4 vehicles provided by locals. Accommodation is offered in camping areas and guesthouses located in the hospitable villages of the Kurbin Highlands.

A unique experience awaits visitors at Sandri's Castle in Gallatë, a special location situated in a very picturesque spot, where hospitality meets the tranquillity of nature and the cultural richness of the area.


5 Skanderbeg Mountain Range

The Skanderbeg Mountains are stunning and naturally beautiful with abundant vegetation and dramatic terrain The range begins in the east with Mount Skanderbeg near Shkopet, then passes through Mëlleza Peak (1,123 m), ontinues with Huti Peak (1,316 m) and reaches its highest oint at Lake Peak (1,724 m). The western range's highest oint is Kunora (Crown) Peak above Milot (745 m), followed by **Suka Peak** (675 m). This mountain range is a perfect destination for all nature lovers, both those who prefer slow peaceful walks to adventurers seeking challenges in every season. The variety of trails offers different levels of difficulty, from scenic walks for beginners to lengthy steep routes for experience enthusiasts.


More than two days are needed to fully explore Mount Skanderbeg so as to fully experience hiking or mountain biking through the rugged terrain. The journey becomes even more special as the trails follow the historic paths of Skanderbeg and his warriors, turning each step into a ourney through nature and history.

The most recommended trails are:

• Former Archbishopric of Durrës – St. Anthony's Church **Trail**, 6 km long, suitable for beginner hikers




• St. Anthony's Church - Church of St. Friday, 10.8 km long, suitable for moderate hikers due to the natural hill




Locals refer to these two trails as The Monk's Trail.


• Church of St. Friday – Huti Peak Trail, 5.7 km long through mountainous natural terrain, suitable for moderate hikers.
