

Kurbin's Cultural and Gastronomic Heritage

Located just 20 km from Rinas International Airport, Kurbin is an area that is sandwiched between two popular tourist destinations – Kruja, the very symbol of Albanian history and tradition, and Shëngjin, one of the most renowned seaside locations in the country. This geographical location makes the area an ideal stop for visitors who wish to experience history, culture and gastronomy in one go.

Renowned for its cuisine, Kurbin attracts both local and foreign visitors who enjoy its exquisite traditional cuisine, fresh local products and warm hospitality in the restaurants and agrotourism establishments in the area.

This gastronomic wealth is part of Kurbin's intangible cultural heritage, an area where the tradition of cooking is closely linked to its history, music, songs, dances, festivals and rites. Its culinary culture is not simply about food, as such. It is, instead, an excellent way to experience its local identity and culture in its entirety.

One of the most sought-after experiences is **Patok's Seafood Itinerary**, where one finds first-rate fresh fish products that come from the nearby lagoon. An increasing number of visitors also take the Olive Route in the interior of Kurbin, where traditional cuisine is combined with authentic products of the area and the history of olive trees that are thousands of years old.

Therefore, the gastronomy of Kurbin is a bridge that connects cultural heritage and contemporary tourism, creating a wholesome and authentic experience for every

The Patok Lagoon is the most popular seafood destination in Albania, featuring over 27 restaurants that offer unique ways of cooking seafood both within the Lagoon and in the surrounding areas. Visitors can also enjoy traditional seafood specialties in places such as Gurëz (a restaurant called "Laguna e Vjetër") and Fushë-Kuqe (restaurant called "Misiri i Lokës"), located next to the picturesque site known as the Pheasant Woods ("Pylli i Fazanëve").

Visitors **may enjoy various types of seafood**, ranging from grilled fish to innumerable seafood dishes, such as traditional eel casseroles perfectly combined with fresh vegetable salads, corn bread dipped in delicious brine and local artisanal wines from the neighbouring areas of Rrëshen and Lezhë.

The stunning view over the Patok Lagoon and the entire Bay of Drin on the Adriatic Sea is mesmerising. Coupled with the welcoming service of the local restaurants, visitors are guaranteed to experience a warm family atmosphere in which dining becomes an unforgettable experience as the lagoon's natural beauty blends effortlessly with culinary traditions. Fresh fish and other seafood are cooked using recipes that have been handed down through generations, preserving their authentic taste and reflecting Kurbin's culinary identity.

Enjoy the natural beauties of Patok's Lagoon

Located in the Patok-Fushë-Kuqe-Ishëm region, the Patok Lagoon is a protected area of about 47 km2 and part of the Kune-Vain-Tale-Patok-Fushë-Kuqe-Ishëm Natural Reserve that lies along the Adriatic coast between the delta of Mat River and Cape Rodon. Some of its most important areas are the Patok Lagoon, the Mat Delta, Droja, and Gordulla and Negli Swamps.

Other than its natural values (aquatic and terrestrial flora and fauna), this protected reserve affords breathtaking vistas, whilst providing ample opportunities for nature

Fishing

The local angler's association is happy to help out with their boats and extensive knowledge of the area. It is in their pleasant company that many hours and indeed entire days may be spent in the local lagoon or deltas fishing with nets, traps or simply fishing rods.

Water enthusiasts may take boat rides in the lagoon, visit small islets and bathe in charming beaches of the virgin areas of Mat and Droja estuaries in the Adriatic. Adventure seekers, on the other hand, may enjoy kayaking in the lagoon, rafting in River Mat, walking or biking in the natural trails by the lagoon, as well as many other adventures.

Local beautiful homes with courtyards filled with flowers and fruit trees, and small arable plots of land tilled with particular craftsmanship attract many countryside lovers but also awaken the desire of any nature-loving visitor to get to know the area as well as possible.



The crowning jewel of all the local treasures is the Diocesan Shrine, Church of "Our Lady of Good Counsel" in the village of Gurëz. The Catholic Church, with its architecture, is one of the most important centers of Catholic faith in the area. Inside the Diocesan Shrine one cannot but be touched by the stories of the clergy who were brutally killed during the communist regime. It is a museum that testifies to the sacrifices that people in this area were prepared to go through to fiercely protect their faith and religion.

Accommodation

Visitors may find accommodation in many guesthouses, in the camping areas adjacent to many local restaurants or in various hotels alongside the main national highway.

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Millennial Olive Groves Experience the culture and tradition of Kurbin

Enjoy the heart of Kurbin, the rich flavours of traditional food and the millennia-old legends of

Kurbin is renowned for its fertile land and olive plantations that are thousands of years old not only in Gjorm, Zhejë, Shënmri (St. Mary's) and Mamurras but also throughout the hilly province. Olive trees are the natural witnesses to Kurbin's ancient history and traditions. Local residents proudly tell visitors how every newlywed couple would plant an olive tree on their wedding day, as a symbol of good fortune and their bond to the soil beneath their feet.

Visitors may visit the heart of Kurbin's territory and its olive groves either **on foot, by bike or car**, commencing their journey in the Adriatic coast and moving on to the hills where the centuries-old olive trees of Gjorm, Zhejë and Shënmri stand. To this day, local residents are proud to show guests the traditional way used to make olive oil, offering an authentic and unforgettable agrotourism experience.

The Olive Tour, already known across the Mediterranean, offers a rich experience to visitors.

If promoted appropriately, Kurbin's olive groves can become an important destination of this regional tour, blending the traditional, cultural and authentic taste of the region.



Rich cuisine

may enjoy olive oil tasting or the delights of typical local dishes and products, such as chicken with porridge (pulë me gull), fried pork, kid goat meat from St. Mary's cooked in karabec and beans, canned olives, laknur, seasonal vegetables, black cabbage and local cheese accompanied by wine and artisanal *raki*.

Local establishments offer rich specialties of Kurbin's traditional cuisine. The proprietors of *The Lahuta* e Vjetër Restaurant (The Old Lute), a family-run establishment, encourage visitors to join the family and cook traditional dishes with them, as well as to take part in the daily chores of the business, and, as such, experiencing the countryside and its reality first-hand.

Other than the delectable food, there is no shortage of traditional festivities, such as the Zheja Festival, a blend of festivities and the Zheja wedding rite, St. Mary's Festival, Kurbin's Fli Festival and the Olive Feast, which further enrich visitors' experience.

Other natural attractions

Where olive groves end, the Skanderbeg Mountain range begins with the beautiful Gura e Gjormit springs and the delightful stream of Gjatoshi i Zhejës, which flows into Zheja Lake. The course of these waters has created gorges, canyons and several stunning waterfalls, the most prominent of which is the Gjorm Waterfall. Visitors will encounter a mountain full of strawberry trees (Lat. arbutus unedo), the king's plant, a natural refuge for bees which release their honey into the wild. And from here, one cannot possibly overlook the captivating sunsets over the Adriatic, which with their stunning and mesmerising colours, are a magical experience in their own right.

Gjorm, Zheja, Old Zheja and Shënmria are villages closely related to the history of Albania's National Hero, Skanderbeg, the Battle of Albulena (1457) in particular, and religious harmony among local inhabitants. The Tekke of Gjorm, Shelbum's Church in Zheja and St. Mary's Church in Shënmri are very popular religious locations and are frequented by residents of both the Christian and Islamic faiths. The Ruins of St. Mary's Church are a very special cultural asset and have been listed as a cultural monument. Oral records show that Skanderbeg and his wife, Donika, used to take part in services and prayers in this very church in the Middle Ages.

Accommodation


Kurbin offers accommodation for any taste and type of traveller.
